

287(g) in Wake County

About

The 287(g) Program began in Wake County County in 2008. This "deputizes" sheriffs to act as ICE officers and interview immigrants if they enter the jail for whatever reason, even something like driving without a license. There are 6 of these programs in North Carolina and 76 across the country. North Carolina had the most programs until last year when Texas adopted 18 along the border.

Why we oppose it

- 287(g) priorities are not often not followed
- ICE does not properly monitor local law enforcement
- 287(g) officer training is inadequate
- 287(g) gives additional authority to local law enforcement
- it separates families
- it wastes tax payer money

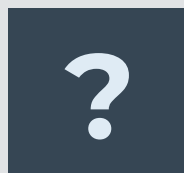
Number of People Identified and Deported
